



## **SITE PROCEDURE FOR FIRST PHASE OF RE-OPENING**

### **Welcome back to Chelmarsh Sailing Club!**

Please follow these simple procedures to respect fellow members. These procedures may be subject to change in line with Government & RYA guidance.

Anyone exhibiting symptoms of coronavirus **should not attend at the club**. This will also apply where someone in the member's household exhibits symptoms.

On arrival at the Club by car, members should park as normal but use common sense to only exit their vehicle if able to maintain a 2 metre separation from another person they do not live with. Please reverse into parking spaces if unloading from the boot.

Members must maintain a 2 metre social distance at all times unless with members of same family with whom they live or household.

Hand washing is an imperative part of good hygiene practice so, on arrival at the Club and at regular intervals please remember to wash your hands thoroughly using soap and water. All doors in use within the ground floor of the Club will be wedged open to permit free access, prevent bottlenecks and unnecessary touching of the contact surfaces. This will include doors to the changing rooms.

For the first phase of re-opening access to the clubhouse will be limited to the female and male toilets only. Only 2 people to be in the male and 2 in the female toilets at any one time. Please use common sense, call out before entering if it's not clear how many people are in the room and maintain 2 metre separation.

Changing and showering is not permitted unless in case of medical emergency. There will be no access to anywhere upstairs in the clubhouse.

Members will be required to change into sailing/SUPping kit at home or in/adjacent to their vehicle. Sailing kit and equipment must be left in the members' vehicle and not in the 'public' areas.

No access to the garage except for the Safety Officer to access boiler.

The keys to the fuel store & SUP container will be in the clubhouse.

Hand sanitiser will be available outside the front & back door to the Clubhouse but members should bring their own supplies of first aid equipment and hand sanitiser for personal use. Members should bring their own food and drink to the Club.

Any personal rubbish must be taken away by members for disposal at home.

Only members are allowed on site.

Members should not touch other member's boat, kit or equipment except in an emergency.
